In Person Classes

Separating Classes

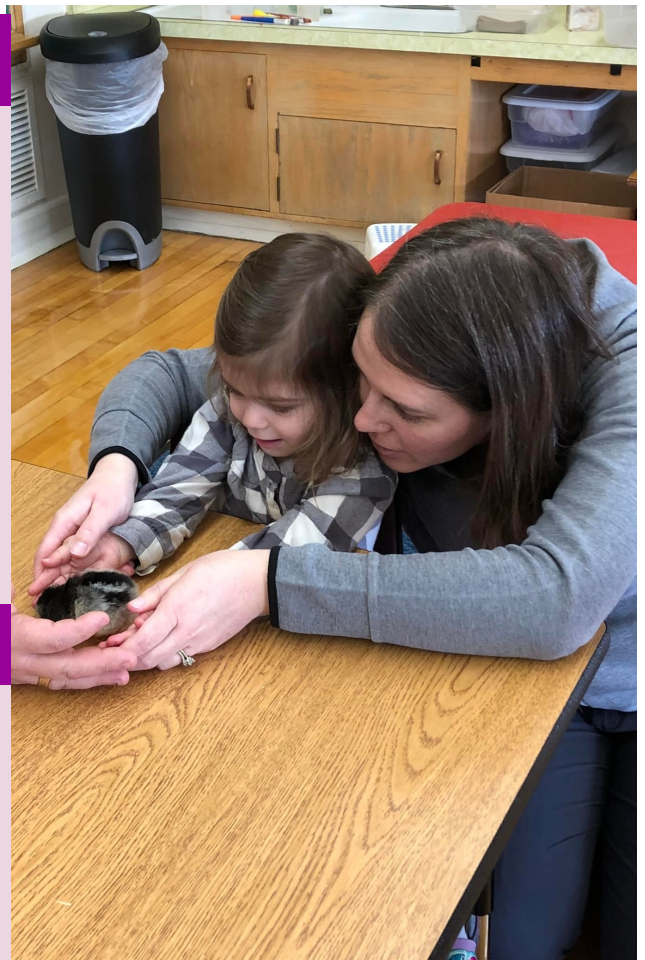
Classes include time with children and their caregivers interacting in early childhood spaces. Caregivers leave the children's space for parent education while children stay and learn from other children and professional staff.

Non-Separating Classes

Play, learn, and sing with your child and other families. Parent education and children's activities happen in one space. If you or your child are not ready to separate or to prefer to use ECFE as a time to play and learn together, look for this type of class.

Home Visits

Make a free appointment with a licensed parent educator to discuss your parenting challenges, receive resources and/or develop a plan that will fit you and your family. A follow-up consultation will be offered if necessary and can be scheduled after your first visit. Call Gina Gunderson at 281-5600.



BIRTH TO KINDERGARTEN ENTRANCE CLASSES



In Birth to Kindergarten Entrance classes, families and their young children come together to explore, play, and learn. The parent educator facilitates conversations on child development and ways to support children's growth and learning while building the parent/child relationship. Early childhood educators engage children in developmentally appropriate activities to support specific needs and growth of all children.

All families with children ages Birth to Kindergarten Entrance are welcome to attend our classes.

OTHER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL (PAC) FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD

The Crookston Public School Early Childhood Parent Advisory Council (PAC) provides input and support to the ECFE and the School Readiness programs.

Our stated purpose is to assist the Early Childhood Coordinator in planning, implementing, and evaluating the ECFE and School Readiness programs. We strive to represent the concerns of participants, raise money, organize and publicize our programs and events, review center policies and programming, and interface with staff.

PAC meetings are held quarterly to review committee work and participant feedback, hear reports from our various liaisons and event coordinators, and discuss larger issues such as legislation, registration, and program goals. Additional meetings are held as needed for fundraising events.

Attending PAC meetings is a great way to learn more about school district programs and make personal connections with other families. Meetings will be held four times during the school year. Child care will be provided with advance notice. Parents of children in ECFE and School Readiness are invited to attend a meeting, as it fits their schedule. All input is welcome!

Early Childhood Screening

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. The State of Minnesota requires that all children are screened prior to entering preschool and kindergarten. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how children are doing between the ages of three and four years. It identifies, at an early stage, possible learning or health concerns so that children can get the help they need before starting school. Early Childhood Screening is *not* a kindergarten entrance test. Crookston Public School's Early Childhood Screening will be held March 10, 11, & 12th, 2027. **Children born by March 1st, 2024, who have not yet been screened, will be eligible.** In February, parents of eligible screening age children will receive information about setting up an appointment for screening. If your child will be eligible and you do not receive a letter in February, please contact us at 281-5600.

School Readiness Programming

The registration process for preschool begins in May when information for the upcoming school year is mailed to families with children who will be three or four years old by September 1. Children who are 5 years old on or before September 1 are eligible for Kindergarten. Classes for the 2026-2027 school year have already been filled. Please inquire if you wish to be placed on a waiting list.

School Readiness offers children five preschool sessions a week, guided by a professional early childhood educator. Children have the opportunity to become comfortable with going to school, making the transition to kindergarten easier! The goals of the School Readiness Program are to encourage children's physical, social, cognitive, and language development based on Minnesota's early Childhood Indicators of Progress. These standards lay the foundation for later academic success.

The family will be contacted by the local school district to arrange for a screening or evaluation to determine if their child is eligible for Infant and Toddler Intervention or Preschool Special Education services. Program Details and Policies

- There is a fee for each weekly class. A supply fee may apply.
- Events are free. A supply fee may apply.
- The maximum enrollment may vary with each class.
- Contact the Washington School office for reduced fee information or payment forms.
- No family will be turned away due to inability to pay.
- Refunds are not available.

What are the goals for ECFE participants

1. Parent-child relationships support the child's development in physical well-being and motor development, social and emotional development, approaches to learning, language development, communication skills, cognition, and general knowledge.
2. Parents understand the importance of their role and how it changes over time.
3. Parents have the knowledge and realistic expectations to anticipate and meet the developmental needs of their children.
4. Parents demonstrate sensitive and responsive care and interactions with their children.
5. Parents and children experience a smooth transition from early childhood programs and services into kindergarten and the K-12 system.
6. Parents are engaged in their children's learning and education in the school age years.
7. Families participate in formal and informal social networks in their communities that support effective parenting.
8. Families are knowledgeable about and use community resources.
